

DIRECTIONS FROM THE AIRPORT TO PRESIDENT HOTEL

The easiest way, obviously, is to take a taxi. The fare is a flat 38 euros for travel from 5:00 to 24:00 and 54 euros for travel from 0:00 to 5:00.

By Metro

1. From the Airport take the **BLUE Metro** line (Line 3). The Airport is the last stop, so the Metro only goes one way from it.
2. Get off either at **PANORMOU** or **AMBELOKIPI** stop (11 stops, about 35 minutes). Both stops serve President Hotel.
3. Follow the map below to President Hotel.

The Metro runs to/from the Airport every 30 minutes. As of this writing, it leaves the Airport at 00 and 30 minutes past the hour. The first Metro leaves at 6:30 and the last at 23:30. Departure times are shown on the billboard at the ticket area, at the platforms, and at <http://www.stasy.gr/index.php?id=70&L=1>

If you have just missed it and do not want to wait for the next one, there is an alternative. You can take the Suburban Railway (yellow line on the map) up to **Doukissis Plakentias** (4 stops) and switch there for the Metro.

The Suburban Railway runs every 30 minutes (at 15 and 52 minutes past the hour). The first train departs at 5:52 and the last at 22:15. The ticket is the same, and from **Doukissis Plakentias** the Metro runs every few minutes. At **Doukissis Plakentias** make sure you take the Metro towards **Aghia Marina** and not back towards the Airport.

Tickets:

- The Airport ticket is 10 euros and is valid for unlimited city metro, bus and tram rides for 90 minutes after validation. You can get it at the automatic vending machines or the ticket office (support somebody's job). Remember to validate it before you go down to the train platform.
- If you are traveling with companions you can get a group ticket for 2 people for 18 euros, or for 3 people for 24 euros (valid for 90 minutes). This includes the Airport.
- A 3-day Tourist ticket for all Mass Transit Modes (city metro, bus and tram) costs 22 euros. This **includes** one trip from the Airport and one trip to the Airport.
- A 24-hour (Daily) ticket for all Mass Transit Modes (city metro, bus and tram) costs 4.5 euros. This does **not** include trips to/from the Airport.
- A 5-day ticket for all Mass Transit Modes (city metro, bus and tram) costs 9 euros. This does **not** include trips to/from the Airport

Note: Feel free to ask people for help and directions. Greeks generally speak English and, even if they don't, they will try to communicate with you using gestures and/or Greeklish.
